Estimated additional expenses

Additional living and travel expenses are estimated at CHF 1,800 per month on average over the 16-month period, including on-campus accommodation, flights, health insurance (5), local living taxes and inscription fees with the Swiss Authorities (6).

These prices are defined based on the inflation rate forecasted by the Swiss National Bank (BNS). If there is a strong variation, EHL will make adjustments accordingly. On-Campus Accommodation & Parking

300 rooms are available on site at EHL. All students residing on campus benefit from an optimal setup, with easy access to school, EHL's numerous facilities, the beautiful local surroundings and regular public transport links to Lausanne.

Housing

The average monthly fee per person is between CHF 800 and CHF 1,400 and varies according to location, features and academic program. This rate is subject to change depending on the progress of the development work of the new EHL Campus. For comparison purposes, a simple studio in the Lausanne region leases for approximately CHF 1,400 per month (utilities included), excluding heating, electricity, maintenance, linen (bedding and towels), wifi, and are generally for a 12-month period minimum.

Parking

The average monthly fee per parking space is CHF 200 and varies according to location and whether it is free or assigned.

General Condition

Housing and parking fees are invoiced for the duration of the academic semester in which the student is enrolled. Heating, electricity and internet costs as well as bed linen, towels and weekly cleaning are included in the price. There is a tourist tax of CHF 18.50 per 15 days. This will be invoiced to students whose legal address is not in Switzerland (legal obligation) for the duration of their stay on campus.

Down Payment, Invoicing and Deposit

Down Payment (Reservation)

A CHF 6,000 down payment is required to guarantee enrollment in the program, and must be paid as soon as the acceptance letter to the program has been received by the student. This amount is non-refundable, except in extreme circumstances. The down payment amount will be deducted from the total amount due for the EHL semester.

Invoicing

Once enrollment has been confirmed, students will be charged the totality of EHL's tuition and compulsory fees (art. 160 & ff, Code des Obligations). The payment will be due 30 days from the invoice date.

Deposit (reimbursed at the end of the EHL semester)

A deposit of CHF 2,500 will be required. It is reimbursable at the end of the EHL semester. It covers any extraordinary costs incurred by the student for example due to damage to rooms or other installations. Interest earned on the deposit will accrue and be added to EHL's scholarship fund, as part of the institution's social responsibility policy for the education of students with financial difficulties. Students wishing to abandon their studies during their semester at EHL should contact EHL's financial department to obtain details about their eligibility to request a refund of their deposit.

Important Note:

The following section applies to the EHL semester. Please contact an admission officer to obtain more details about the fees and expenses structure at the other two universities.

1. Tuition Fees

Tuition and compulsory expenses will be paid separately by the student to each institution before arrival on the respective campuses. University of Houston: Texas residents may be eligible for a 30% discount on University of Houston tuition fees.

2. Facilities and Service Fees

- The right to access different restaurants and bars, including reductions for all meals
- The right to access sports facilities and sports activity training
- The right to access EHL stores and products at discounted prices
- Student Affairs Services (communication, coach, psychological support, sport and health center)
- Customer Financial services (individual management of customer accounts)
- The Internships and Careers Office (preparation and monitoring of internships, Job Fair, guidance, etc.)
- Access to Digital Centre and professional printshop services
- Access to office automation licenses at preferential rates
- Access to Alumni services (lifetime membership and email)
- Flat rate obligatory insurance, including complementary accident insurance, public liability insurance, theft insurance and supplementary computer equipment insurance covering theft and damage
- Discounted dry cleaning service
- Contribution to examination costs
- Copyright, licenses and languages
- Reception and postal service
- Cleaning and maintenance of outdoor areas
- Waste collection tax (selective sorting)
- Relations with neighbors and site security

3. Prepaid Food and Beverage Account (based on consumption)

At the beginning of the EHL semester, student cards are credited with a mandatory amount considered as the minimum a student will spend on food and beverage on campus. The prepaid amount is not refundable and must be used before the end of the semester. As part of the institution's social responsibility policy for the education of students with financial difficulties, any remaining amount at the end of the semester is transferred to EHL's scholarship fund. Food and beverage expenditures on other campuses are handled locally upon the student's arrival.

4. Field Trips

Field trips are a compulsory part of the program. Expenses are estimated and subject to change with currency variations and other factors. The field trip fee for the EHL semester is all-inclusive, covering travel, lodging and F&B.

5. Mandatory Health Insurance (legal obligation)

A basic health and accident insurance is mandatory by law in Switzerland. Students whose fiscal residence is outside Switzerland (or whose parents' fiscal residence is outside Switzerland) at the time they start their studies at EHL are automatically enrolled in EHL's health and accident insurance plan (CHF 152/month). It is possible to be exempted from this insurance coverage by providing sufficient proof of adequate coverage to the Swiss authorities. For the rest of the program outside Switzerland, other insurance options are available.

6. Swiss Authorities

Administrative taxes are collected by the Swiss authorities for students in the process of applying for a residence permit or visa. These may include other communal and cantonal fees. Amounts may vary according to the nationality of the student. Swiss authorities require students from outside the EU/EFTA to make an initial payment of CHF 24,000 before submitting a visa application. This amount will be deducted from their first invoice. It includes the CHF 6,000 required as down payment.
